VETERANS HEALTHCARE ADMINISTRATION (VHA)

Basic Eligibility Requirements for VA Healthcare:

- Verified active duty military service
- Separation status of Honorable or General Under Honorable Conditions
- Twenty-four (24) months of continuous active duty service after 9/7/1980 (minimum service requirement of one (1) day prior to this date)

VA encourages all Veterans to apply for healthcare benefits so that enrollment eligibility can be determined on an individual basis as there may be several exceptions to the above listed basic requirements.

To apply for VA Healthcare Benefits, complete **VA Form 10-10EZ** "Application for Health Benefits" and submit it to one of the Health Benefits Enrollment Offices listed above or online at www.1010ez.med.va.gov. Veterans will also need their most recent tax return, Social Security numbers for yourself and qualified dependents, and account numbers for any current health insurance you have. **VA Form 10-10EZ** applications may also be mailed to:

MISSION ACT INFORMATION

The VA Maintaining Internal Systems and Strengthening Integrated Outside Networks Act of 2018 (MISSION Act) replaced the VA CHOICE Program on June 6, 2019. The MISSION Act altered community care eligibility and established the new criteria as follows:

- 1. <u>Wait Time</u>: Veterans who are unable to obtain an appointment within 20 days for their Primary Care, or 28 days for Specialty Care, may request to be sent to a community-based care provider.
- 2. <u>Drive Time</u>: Veterans who would be required to drive for longer than 30 minutes for Primary Care, or one hour for Specialty Care, may request to be sent to a community-based care provider.
- 3. <u>Best Medical Interest</u>: A VA Primary Care Provider and a Veteran may both agree that it is in the Best Medical Interest of the Veteran to receive care from a community-based provider.

MENTAL HEALTH CARE & RESOURCES

Call 9-1-1 for Psychiatric Emergencies

Jade-Opal Clinic: Offers same-day mental health services and referrals for treatment.

Walk-In Hours: Monday through Friday 0800-1500 at the Phoenix VA Medical Center Main Hospital (1st Floor, near the Emergency Department). Urgent mental health issues outside of these hours will be referred to the VA Emergency Department (1st Floor).

Veteran's Crisis Hotline: 1-800-273-8255 (Press 1) for 24/7 confidential support for Veterans in crisis, and families and friends.

Social Workers: All Patient Aligned Care Teams (PACT) include a dedicated Social Worker to provide Veterans such assistance and resources as may be available. Veterans are encouraged to contact their Primary Care Providers or PACT to address such issues or be referred to the appropriate care. **VA Social Workers may have knowledge of or access to resources not listed in this guide.**

Substance Abuse Treatment Programs

Substance Abuse Residential Rehabilitation Treatment Program (SARRTP): Inpatient based Substance Abuse Treatment administered by Phoenix VA at the Main Hospital. Speak with your Primary Care Provider or call (602) 277-5551, Ext. 3952 or 5399 for more information.

Substance Use Disorder Treatment Program (SUDTP): Outpatient based Substance Abuse Treatment administered by Phoenix VA at the Main Hospital. Speak with your Primary Care provider or call (602) 277-5551, Ext. 6471 for more information.

Other Special VA Social Work Programs & Services

Psychosocial Rehabilitation & Recovery Center (PRRC): A program which focuses on intensive outpatient programming, including individual and group psychotherapy, recreational therapy, psycho-education, and community integration. Veterans with a Mental Health assessment within the past 12 months are eligible with a referral from a Mental Health Care Provider at Phoenix VA. Call (602) 222-6471 for more information.

Transition & Care Management (TCM): A program with a focus on those Veterans who have recently returned from deployment and/or are transitioning from the DoD health car system to the VA. Call (602) 277-5551, Ext. 6750 for more information.

Compensated Work Therapy (CWT): A program utilizing a vocational model for recovery and treatment which provides vocational services and support to help facilitate re-entry into the employment sector. Speak to your Primary Care or Mental Health Provider or call (602) 277-5551, Ext. 5987 for more information.

Health Care for the Homeless Community Resource & Referral Center (CRRC): A facility with various resources for Veterans with a focus on housing and access to information and peer support. Walk-ins are welcomed Monday through Friday from 0730 – 1600 at 1500 E. Thomas Road, Suite 106, Phoenix, AZ 85014. The Housing & Urban Development VA Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH) program, with the goal of returning homeless Veterans to permanent housing, is also managed at this facility. Call (602) 248-6040 for more information.

Veterans Justice Outreach (VJO): A program that aims to avoid the unnecessary criminalization of mental illness and extended incarceration of Veterans by ensuring that eligible, Justice-involved Veterans have timely access to the Veterans Health Administration (VHA) services they need. This program is based out of the CRRC so visit them or call (602) 248-6040 for more information.

Outpatient Recreational Therapy: A program offering a wide-range of recreation modalities and interventions as treatment and education to assist Veterans with disabilities and other limitations to establish and develop a lifestyle that focuses on functional independence and whole health well-being. To apply for VA disability benefits, complete **VA Form 21-526** "Veteran's Application for Compensation and/or Pension" or online at www.ebenefits.va.gov.

Service Connected Compensation: If a disability is the result of an injury, disability, or event in military service.

Non-Service Connected Pension Eligibility:

- Age 65 or older OR are permanently and totally-disabled,
- Active duty service with at least one (1) day during a period of war,
- Twenty-four (24) months of continuous active duty service after 9/7/1980 (minimum service requirement of one (1) day prior to this date), AND
- Income and net worth do not exceed the annual income limit set by law.

Adding or Withdrawing Dependents: If a Veteran is receiving disability compensation from VA with a disability rating of 30% or greater, they may add eligible dependents to their compensation benefits to get a higher payment to help support their family. Veterans may submit documents to claim additional dependents, or withdraw them, at the VA Regional Office or mail or fax them to:

- To add a dependent: VA Form 21-686c "Declaration of Status of Dependents" must be submitted.
 - o A spouse (including spouses in same-sex marriages and common-law marriages)
 - o Children (including biological children, step children, and adopted children) who are unmarried and either:
 - Under 18 years of age, or
 - Over 18 years of age but were seriously disabled before the age of 18, or
 - Between the ages of 18 and 23 and attending school full-time
 - For children over 18 years of age, but in school full-time, VA Form 21-674 "Request for Approval of School Attendance" must also be submitted.
- To add a parent as a dependent: VA Form 21P-509 "Statement of Dependency of Parent(s)" must be submitted.
 - To qualify, a parent must be in the Veteran's direct care and whose income and net worth do not exceed the limit set by law.

How to Obtain a Copy of your DD-214 or Military Medical Records: If you have been discharged within the past two years, you may contact your most recent command to obtain a copy of your DD-215 and Military Medical Records. If it has been longer than two years, you may request such records online, or by mail or fax. Complete Standard Form 180 "Request Pertaining to Military Records," or apply online at www.archives.gov/veterans/military-service-records

VA Healthcare Eligibility Review for Other-Than-Honorable & Bad Conduct Discharges: Requests may be submitted using VA Form 7131 "Exchange of Beneficiary Information and Request for Administrative and Adjudicative Action."

Discharge Upgrade: A review of military discharge may be requested using **DD Form 293** "Application for the Review of Discharge from the Armed Forces of the United States."

Re-Starting Benefits: If existing VA benefits have been stopped, halted, or suspended due to incarceration, "Release Papers" must be presented to the VA Regional Office upon release from custody to restart your benefits at VA.

VA Home Loans Program: A program to help servicemembers, Veterans, and eligible surviving spouses become homeowners. Please visit the VA Regional Office or visit https://www.benefits.va.gov/homeloans/index.asp to learn more.

CHAMPVA Dependent Healthcare: Veterans who meet certain criteria may enroll their eligible dependents into the Civilian Health And Medical Program at VA (CHAMPVA). Visit the VA Regional Office or call 1-800-733-8387 for more information.

Education & Vocational Benefits

G.I. Bill: There are many versions of the G.I Bill, to include the Montgomery G.I. Bill (Ch. 30), Post-9/11 G.I. Bill (Ch. 33), REAP G.I. Bill (Ch. 1607), & Select Reserve G.I. Bill (Ch. 1606). Be Connected is an Arizona-centric Veterans Program aimed at assisting Veterans in seeking help, linking them to personalized resource matching & navigation support, and providing training and skill development to equip them to help others. Resources are also available to help with many facets of life, to include employment, peer support, and volunteer opportunities.

Arizona State-Based Veterans Benefits

Arizona State Veterans Home:

The State of Arizona currently has two skilled care nursing facilities, one in Phoenix and one in Tucson and another under construction in Yuma (Projected for June 2021). Some Veteran's spouses may also be admitted. Contact AZDVS to determine eligibility.

Arizona Veteran Cemeteries:

The State of Arizona currently has three Veteran's Cemeteries, one each in Marana, Sierra Vista, and Camp Navajo. Any Veteran (other than those Dishonorably Discharged) are eligible for burial and spouses and some dependents may also qualify. Contact AZDVS to get more information. There is no fee for Honorably Discharged Veterans to be interred and a one-time, nominal fee for spouse and other eligible dependents.

Arizona Tax Benefits:

Income Tax: Active Duty pay is not subject to Arizona Income Tax and Federal retirement payments (Civil Service or Military) up to \$2,500 are tax-free.

Vehicle License Tax and Registration Fees: License taxes and registration fees are waived for Veterans with a VA Disability Rating of 100%. Veterans are also exempt from license tax on vehicles they acquire through financial aid from VA. This also applies to a Veteran's spouse, if the Veteran dies, until and if the spouse remarries. Contact your local Arizona Motor Vehicle Department Office to learn more.

Property Tax: In some cases, Veterans may be eligible to have their Property Tax reduced or waived based on their disability. This may also apply to widows and widowers of Veterans. Contact your County Assessor's office for eligibility and information.

Arizona Veteran Education Benefits:

Arizona Purple Heart Tuition Waiver: This scholarship is available to:

- 1. Post 9/11 veterans with a VA Disability rating of at least 50%, a Purple Heart Medal, and who were AZ Residents during their service.
- 2. Dependent Children under 30, and un-remarried spouses of Arizona members who were killed in the line of duty on or after September 11, 2001.
- 3. Post 9/11 Arizona National Guard members who were medically discharged or received a Purple Heart Medal.

Arizona Veteran Employment Benefits:

Veterans who pass an examination for employment by the State of Arizona, or a county or city therein, will have 5 points added to their certification score; Veterans receiving any amount of VA Disability Compensation will have 10 points added. This is available only for Honorably Discharged Veterans who served longer than 6 months. Certain spouses may also be eligible. Check with the hiring authority of the agency, office, or institution to which you applied for eligibility and more information.

Arizona Veteran Recreation Benefits:

Hunting & Fishing Licenses: Free Hunting/Fishing Combo licenses are available to Veterans with a VA Disability Rating of 100% and have been an Arizona Resident for at least 12 consecutive months. Active Duty members shall receive hunting and fishing licenses at the Resident rate. Contact the Arizona Game and Fish Department at (602) 942-3000 or visit them at https://www.azgfd.com for more information.

Arizona State Parks: Free "Disable Veteran Annual Day Use Passes" are available to Veterans with a VA Disability Rating of 100% Permanent and Total, allowing access to all 27 of Arizona's state parks. Contact the Arizona State Parks and Trails Department at (602) 542-4174 or visit them at https://AZStateParks.com for more information.
